The Diagnosis and Management of COPD in Primary Care

The PCRS-UK is delighted to announce the launch of its updated booklet on the diagnosis and management of COPD in primary care. This highly popular succinct reference guide, based on guidance from the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE), Guideline CG101, has been revised and rewritten to incorporate the latest advice from NICE, reflecting;

• Changes in the parameters of airflow limitation used for diagnosing COPD.

- Increasing recognition that COPD is not just a disease of the lungs, but is a multi-system disease requiring multidimensional assessment and an holistic approach to management.
- Increasing evidence that pharmacological and nonpharmacological therapy not only improves current control (symptoms, health status, activity levels) but also can reduce future risk of exacerbations, disease progression and mortality.

COPD is a major cause of morbidity and mortality in the United Kingdom with over 27,000 deaths per annum, and COPD exacerbations are the second most common cause of hospital admissions resulting in huge costs to the NHS.

This booklet, developed by the PCRS-UK and supported by the British Lung Foundation (BLF), aims to provide simple yet structured, evidence-based advice in managing real patients with COPD in your practice during everyday consultations.
