TEETH FOUND IN 1,600-YEAR-OLD TUMOUR

Researchers in Barcelona have found the first ancient remains of a calcified ovarian teratoma containing four teeth and a small piece of bone, in the pelvis of a skeleton of a woman from the Roman era.¹

Teratomas are usually benign and contain remains of organic material such as hair, teeth, bones and other tissues. The find by the researchers from the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona confirms the presence in antiquity of this type of tumour.

The tumour was found in the right hand part of the pelvis of a woman of between 30 and 40 years of age and who lived around 1,600 years ago. Her skeleton was recovered with 86 others in a Roman cemetery in the archaeological site of La Fogonussa, Lleida, in North-Eastern Spain. The woman's skeleton was complete and well-preserved, buried in a tile grave.

Teratomas are asymptomatic in 60% of cases. In the case of the Roman woman, the researchers do not discount the possibility that the tumour caused her death. It is also possible that she lived all her life with the calcified tumour with no further complications.

WARNING ON TOOTH WHITENING REGULATION BREACHES

The new regulations on tooth whitening bring heavy penalties for those who breach the conditions which accompany them, warns Head of Healthcare Regulatory Andrea James of George Davies Solicitors.

If you breach the new law, which came in on 31 October 2012 in response to an EU directive on consumer safety, the maximum penalty is six months imprisonment and/or a fine of up to £5,000. Trading Standards Officers can legally enter and inspect a dental practice at any time to see if a breach has occurred. In addition, the General Dental Council (GDC) will consider fitness to practise proceedings separate to any criminal proceedings against any dental practitioner involved in breaching the regulations.

LONDON DENTAL PATIENTS CONFUSED AND WARY

According to a nationally representative sample of 2,041 adults, dental patients in London are more confused about pricing and the options available to them than patients in any other region. The study, conducted by ICM Research in April 2012, also showed that Londoners are less trusting of their dentists.

Table 1 shows the proportion of patients that agree to statements about their dentists in London *versus* the rest of Great Britain.
