## For authors: How to anonymize a manuscript for double-blind peer review

- Ensure that there is no author information in the metadata of any of the files submitted. Metadata is usually added automatically from the identity information on your computer. In many commonly used programmes, (such as Word and Acrobat reader), author information is displayed (and can be edited) under the 'File' tab.
- When referring to your own work within the manuscript, use neutral terminology; that is, replace
  phrases like "as we have shown before" with "as it has been shown before" (and refer to the
  appropriate published work).
- Do not include work in the reference list that has not been accepted for publication yet.
- Remove any Acknowledgments or Author Contributions from the manuscript, AND place them in the cover letter. The information can be transferred after completion of the peer-review process.
- Please state in the cover letter the full author list and affiliations, with the author list in the order that it should appear on the paper in the event of publication.
- Do not include names or affiliations anywhere in the manuscript or in any Supplementary Information.
