Professor A. M. Jaffe has been appointed professor of physics at Harvard University.

Professor Robert McAdam, head of the Department of Mining Engineering, has been appointed vice-president of Heriot-Watt University in succession to Professor Raymond Smart.

Dr J. R. Hobbs, Royal Postgraduate Medical School, has been appointed to the chair of chemical pathology tenable at the Westminster Medical School, University of London. The title of professor of entomology has been conferred on Dr R. F. Chapman in respect of his post at Birkbeck College; the title of professor of rock mechanics has been conferred on Dr E. Hoek in respect of his post at the Imperial College of Science and Technology and that of professor of chemistry has been conferred on Dr A. J. B. Robertson in respect of his post at King's College.

The following appointments have been made in the University of Manchester: Professor I. E. Gillespie, at present titular professor of surgery in the University of Glasgow, will succeed Professor A. M. Boyd in the chair of surgery and directorship of the Department of Surgery; Mr R. A. Sellwood, assistant director of the Surgical Unit at St Mary's Hospital Medical School, London, will be the first holder of the new chair of surgery, instituted in connexion with the development, for teaching purposes, of the University Hospital of South Manchester; Mr James Parkhouse, postgraduate dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Sheffield, has been appointed to the newly established chair of anaesthesia; Mr J. M. Evanson, senior lecturer in medicine at the university, will be the first holder of a recently instituted, additional chair of medicine; the new chair of geriatric medicine will be held by Mr J. C. Brocklehurst, at present consultant in geriatric and general medicine at Guy's Hospital, London; Dr A. A. Grant, senior lecturer in dental prosthetics in the University of Melbourne, will succeed Professor Ernest Matthews in the chair of prosthetic dentistry and the directorship of the Prosthetics

Dr Walter Drost-Hansen has been appointed director of the Laboratory for Water Research which has been established in the Department of Chemistry, University of Miami. The purpose of the new laboratory is to provide a focal point for coordinated studies of the chemical, biological and physical phenomena of water and aqueous solutions and to establish a strong link between the Department of Chemistry and the Division of Chemical Oceanography at the University's Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Sciences.

Dr H. L. Hartnagel, University of Sheffield, has been appointed to the new chair of electrical engineering, within the Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering, University of Newcastle upon Tyne.

Professor G. D. Sims, of the Department of Electronics, has been appointed a deputy vice-chancellor of the University of Southampton for 2 years from October 1, 1970.

The 1970 Franklin Medal has been awarded to Professor Wolfgang K. H. Panofsky of Stanford University for his contributions to high energy physics and particularly for his work in connexion with the high energy linear electron accelerator at Stanford University.

Control of the Marine Station at Millport, on the Firth of Clyde, is to be transferred from the Scottish Marine Biological Association to the Universities of London and Glasgow. To be known as the Marine Biological Station, Millport, it will continue as a centre for research and supply of specimens, but there will now be more emphasis on teaching. The director will be Professor N. Millott, who relinquishes his chair of zoology at Bedford College, London.
