Oxford International Programme in Evidence-based Health Care, MSc in Evidence-based Health Care

This is a joint Programme with the Department of Primary Health
Care and the Department for Continuing Education's Continuing
Professional Development Centre and a particular aim of the
Programme is to strengthen the natural links with the renowned
Centre for Evidence-Based Medicine in Oxford. This programme has
teachers and contributors who are internationally recognised lead-
ers in the field of evidence-based practice and teaching. The flexible
structure of the course has been devised to fit with the structure of
specialist training and to accommodate student choice.

The MSc in Evidence-Based Health Care is a part-time course
consisting of six taught modules and a dissertation. There are two
compulsory modules, four option modules and a dissertation.

Compulsory Modules:

- The Practice of Evidence-Based Health Care
- Introduction to Study Design and Research Method.

MSc in Evidence for Public Policy and Practice

Evidence for Policy and Practice Information and Co-ordinating (EPPI)
Centre, Social Science Research Unit, Institute of Education, London

This MSc has been designed for graduates and policy-makers, prac-
titioners, managers and researchers who want to become more skilled
in systematic reviewing and develop a critical understanding of the
relationships between research evidence and public policy and prac-
tice. Students will be encouraged to build their studies around their
own areas of interest. These could relate to social welfare, education,
crime and justice, transport, health and health promotion, hous-
ing, or any other area of social policy or practice. This degree can be
completed in 1 year full-time or over 2 years part-time. Core course
modules are delivered in four full-day sessions, 1 week apart. These
modules can be taken as short courses without accreditation. Further
