In late 2004 the Economics of Genetics Services Committee announced new ICD-9-CM codes approved for use after October 1, 2004. ACMG has just learned that two of these codes, V26.31 *Screening for genetic disease carrier status* and V18.9 *Family member is a carrier of a genetic disease*, will not go into effect until October 1, 2005. They will be printed in the 2006 ICD-9-CM Manual. We apologize for any inconvenience this has caused ACMG members.
