## Clinical trials on the Web

This month we have looked into WWW netsites for resources pertaining to the topic of "clinical trials." We searched through well over 1000 documents to get a sense of the kind of information that is currently being

distributed on the net. Based on this sampling, we have grouped WWW information about clinical trials into four categories.

First, there is general background content aimed at interested health-care providers and patients. These sites tend to cover topics concerning a generic clinical trial and include discussions of who might be interested in participating. Next, there are detailed protocols on specific trials and eligibility. We found over one hundred of these, mainly from individual academic institutions and from the US government.

Unfortunately, there is no "master" list of these trials, so finding a trial covering any one particular disease is still a hit or miss process using a search engine. We also found plenty of sites dealing with products and services for conducting and analyzing clinical trials. These sites range from contract research organizations that will perform virtually all aspects of a clinical trial to companies that sell the supplies or software used in trials. Finally, we found some sites that deal with the regulatory issues of testing new pharmaceuticals.
