## Corrigendum: Variant in the sequence of the *LINGO1* gene confers risk of essential tremor

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In the version of this article initially published, one sentence in the abstract and two sentences in the final paragraph of the paper were in error and have been modified.

The final sentence in the abstract should read:

Increased axon integrity observed in *Lingo1* mouse knockout models highlights the potential role of LINGO1 in the pathophysiology of ET. The final three sentences of the paper should read:

Axonal swellings of Purkinje cells are considered to be one of the pathological findings in essential tremor<sup>6</sup>. Increased axon integrity observed in LINGO1 mouse knockout models<sup>16</sup> highlights the potential role of LINGO1 in the pathophysiology of ET and opens up a new field in the research into essential tremor. It is our hope that LINGO1 will point the way to new treatments for severe cases of the disease.
