

A PRACTICAL APPROACH TO SPECIAL CARE IN DENTISTRY



A Practical Approach to Special Care in Dentistry provides an overview of special care dentistry reflecting the most common compromised clinical conditions dentists will regularly encounter. It discusses more than 50 topics based on real-world clinical cases focusing on both patients with disabilities - including physical disabilities, like cerebral palsy and epilepsy, and cognitive impairments, like Down syndrome - and

medically compromised patients - those with infectious diseases, endocrine diseases, hepatorenal disease, and cardiovascular disease.

Each chapter contains a case report establishing the main risk factors, followed by practical adaptations for the reader to follow to minimise the rate and severity of potential complications for their patient. Practical discussions of other special patient situations, like those with allergies, antiresorptive and antiangiogenic drugs, terminal patients, homeless patients, and pregnant or breastfeeding patients are also included in this comprehensive text.

Written by Serpil Djemal, consultant in restorative dentistry at King's College Hospital Dental Institute, this book provides guidance on the assessment, diagnosis and management of traumatic dental injuries.

The book covers enamel, dentine, pulp, crown and root fracture injuries and has chapters on subluxation, extrusion, lateral luxation, intrusion and avulsion, dentoalveolar fractures and long-term consequences.

The 14 chapters examine each type of trauma systematically, with step-by-step protocols and advice on postoperative care and recommended follow-up care,

including splinting and root resorption. Each topic features a clinical case study and is illustrated with high-quality photographs and explanatory diagrams. The main purpose of the book is as a practical guide so discussion in the text is kept to a minimum, but references are provided at the end of each chapter for readers looking for further background information.
