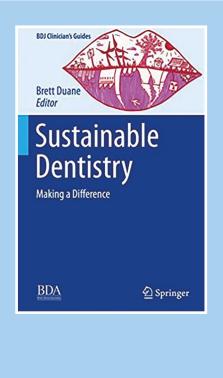
BOOK REVIEW: SUSTAINABLE DENTISTRY: MAKING A DIFFERENCE
