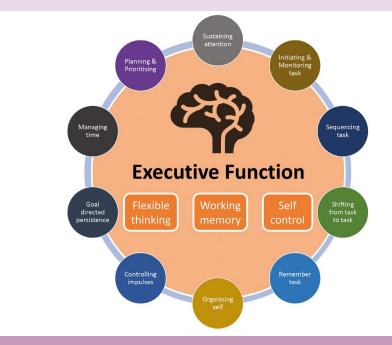
Embracing neurodiversity-informed dentistry. Part two: Oral health considerations
