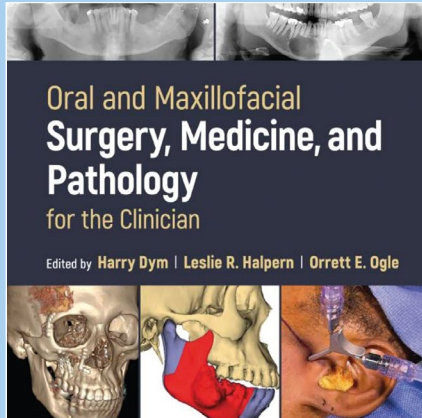

This new text is a one-volume reference that covers surgery, medicine and pathology with the aim of providing key clinical information in a usable and concise manner.

Throughout seven main sections – Basics, Dentoalveolar surgery, Implantology, Trauma, Pathology, Pain control, and Oral medicine – the authors use flow paths to describe clinical scenarios and support the text throughout with charts and algorithms. Topics covered include patient assessment, antibiotic prophylaxis, anaesthesia, medical emergencies, oral mucosal lesions, sedation, post-extraction complications and the treatment of acute and chronic pain.
