Each of the ten chapters provides complete descriptions of the aetiologic factors, explains the prevention of complications, and recommends treatment options associated with these complications. The authors show that most procedural errors can be avoided by adhering to the basic principles

of diagnosis, case selection, treatment planning, access preparation, shaping and cleaning, obturation, restoration, nonsurgical and surgical retreatments, and outcomes assessment.

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
