

# Editor's letter

I was so pleased to hear that on 28 March 2024 the government announced new powers for dental hygienists and therapists.<sup>1</sup> The British Society of Dental Hygiene and Therapy (BSDHT) and the British Association of Dental Therapists (BADT) in particular have fought for many years to be able to supply and administer anaesthesia and fluoride for their patients without dentist sign off.<sup>2,3</sup>

Dr Fiona Sandom, Chair of BADT, said: 'BADT is delighted that dental therapists and dental hygienists will soon be able to supply and administer certain prescription only medicines to patients without a need for a patient specific direction (PSD) or a patient

group direction (PGD).

'This will allow dental therapists and dental hygienists to use their full scope of practice and deliver the care they have been trained and educated to deliver.'
