skip the hydration phase with saline or blood, saving time and decreasing the risk of accidental exposure to pathogens. OsteoBiol *GTO* contains Tecnoss's innovative OsteoBiol *TSV Gel* which ensures optimal stickiness of the material, allowing easy adaptability to the recipient site and extreme stability.

Conceived as a universal biomaterial, easily adaptable to any bone defect, it has proven clinically valid for horizontal augmentation of two-wall defects and socket preservation with compromised buccal plates. It can also be used to treat peri-implant lesions and severe bony defects, also in combination with OsteoBiol *Soft Cortical Lamina*.



Available with soft tissue cuff heights from 1 to 6 mm and a choice of retention levels, Kerator overdenture attachments provide excellent retention so that patients can enjoy the comfort and denture stability that will transform their lives.

Other advantages include a plastic carrier that provides safer handling and easier placement, plus easier visual checking of the implant's alignment. Dual-retention enables increased retention as well as easier pivoting in any direction. Self-alignment automatically centres the male on the housing attachment, allowing patients to easily seat their overdenture. An extended range of male attachments allows for insertion up to 40° of implant divergence, and a 15° angled abutment further extends the allowable divergence. A dual undercut metal housing provides sturdier retention within the denture acrylic.

## Helping to tackle hygiene poverty

The hygiene items are set to be given to refugees,
