Yorkshire-based dental firm, EthOss Regeneration Ltd, has rounded off its eighth consecutive year of growth.

The company, which is headquartered in Silsden, West Yorkshire, produces a groundbreaking dental product called 'EthOss' – a material that encourages new bone growth during dental implant procedures.

And it's donated more than £15,000 to causes including the National Autistic Society, FareShare, Action Medic and Home-Start, and taken part in charitable events including Women V Cancer Ride the Night in Manchester throughout the year.
