Laundry control

These days cross infection within the clinical environment is a hot topic. Is it not a logical assumption to make that we as professionals – who take on board all the risks associated with contamination – should not then be expected to take our soiled uniforms home and launder them ourselves?

We as a profession appear to be expected to transport soiled uniforms within the restricted confines of our own cars – or in my case via public transport – and launder them within our own kitchens.

In dental practices we have strict uniform policies restricting us from being permitted within staff dining environments or stepping outside the practice in uniform. This is to minimise the risk of cross contamination and infection for patients. Is it not therefore of equal importance that we as individuals should be granted that same respect and privilege?

In Denmark I believe staff working within health environments wear clinical scrubs as these are cheaper to supply and are laundered

on site and returned ready for use within the clinical environment to reduce risks. Most dental practices I am aware of do not even make provision for designated changing areas for staff, who are often expected to change and store their own clothing within toilet facilities. Maybe it is time that as staff we are considered equally as important in the fight against infection control.
