

If you book a team-building day, a choice of menu can be selected, including vegetarian and special dietary options. The day begins with champagne, canapés and music so that everyone relaxes, followed by cooking a three-course meal in your team under the guidance of a fully trained chef. You don't even have to do the washing up, and afterwards you can sit down to enjoy the meal you just prepared with a glass of fine wine.

'Every member of the team was involved in all aspects of the day and when we sat down to eat our delicious meal, we felt very pleased with what we had accomplished.'
