Adelaide BioMed City

The A\$3.6 billion Adelaide BioMed City (pictured) is a massive cluster of life sciences infrastructure in the heart of the city, combining education, research and clinical care.

It will be home to Australia's first proton therapy unit and by the end of this year it will grow to 2,000 biomedical researchers, 10,000 total staff and 18,000 daily visitors.

Faster clinical trials

Forty-three and a half per cent of R&D costs will be reimbursed in cash to eligible companies with an aggregated annual turnover of less than A\$20 million (approx. US\$15 million). This Federal Government program covers clinical trials, analytics, study drug manufacture, and other R&D.

All that is required to start a First-in-Human trial in Adelaide is ethics approval, which takes an average of just six weeks, saving six to nine months to start a clinical trial compared to the US or Europe.
